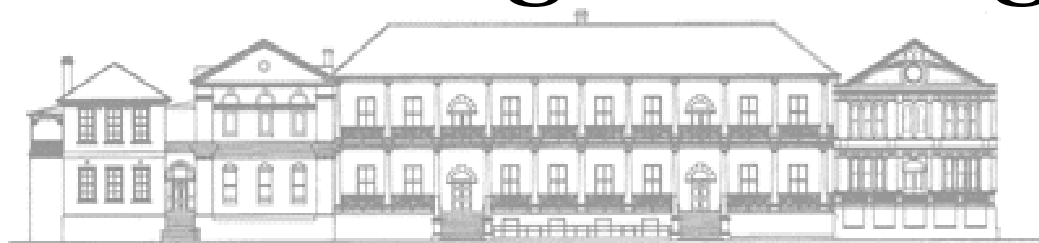


A Little Night Sitting
